Tour of Triune Reminder

On Saturday, November 3, STFB will give an extended tour of the Federal earthworks at Triune, Tennessee. The tour will be led again this year by Tennessee Wars Commission Director of Programs Fred Prouty. This year Fred will take us to see the more extensive sections we did not visit last year.

We will meet at 10 a.m. at the Triune Methodist Church, one mile north of the Highway 96 intersection on Nolensville Road (S.R. 31/41). We will then caravan to the site for a 10:30 a.m. start. Please wear hiking appropriate footwear, a day pack with water, snacks, or a light lunch, and be prepared for mildly strenuous hiking, although a small portion of the earthworks can be viewed without much walking.

An Evening with Mort Kunstler

On Friday, November 30, from 5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m., the Tennessee Civil War Preservation Association (TCWPA) will host "An Evening with Mort Kunstler" at Wilson Hall on the Tennessee State Fairgrounds. This event is being held in conjunction with the Nashville Civil War Show.

Mort Kunstler is America's pre-eminent Civil War artist, with hundreds of best-selling paintings and prints to his credit, in addition to authoring and co-authoring numerous books on his paintings and the war. He has been the subject of a documentary, and he has served as technical advisor to several popular films. This will be Mr. Kunstler's first appearance in Nashville at the annual Civil War Show.

The evening will include a reception, a presentation by the artist, and the opportunity to purchase his newly unveiled print, "Order Out of Chaos: Nathan Bedford Forrest at Nashville, Tenn., February 22, 1862." TCWPA President Steve McDaniel notes, "This is a wonderful opportunity to meet Mr. Kuntsler and learn about his work and his support for battlefield preservation."

The event is open to both TCWPA members and the general public. Admission is \$50 per person, tickets are available in advance only and seating is limited. Checks are payable to "TCWPA" and can be sent to PO Box 148535, Nashville, TN 37214-8535. Proceeds from the event will help support TCWPA's "Sites on Shiloh" campaign to purchase two privately-owned historic tracts of Shiloh battlefield.

Eyewitnesses at the Battle of Perryville

David Logsdon has just released the sixth in a series of Civil War books compiled from eyewitness accounts of the battle's participants. The earlier books chronicle the battles at Ft. Donelson, Franklin, Nashville, Stones River, and Shiloh. *Eyewitnesses at the Battle of Perryville* tells the story of the Oct. 8, 1862 battle, in central Kentucky, through excerpts from letters, diaries, memoirs, etc. written by civilians and soldiers on both sides.

Perryville was the largest Civil War battle in Kentucky and was important because it kept Kentucky from leaving the Union to join the Confederacy. The all-day fighting was fierce as confused commanders on both sides often misdirected their forces and failed to press advantages. The battle was mostly a stalemate, but Braxton Bragg felt compelled to move his Confederate troops south for the next huge battle at Murfreesboro. Much of Logsdon's material for the book came from prominent local researchers, and from the Perryville Battlefield archives. If you enjoyed the earlier Logsdon books on Franklin and Nashville, you need to order this book from STFB \$12 plus \$3.95 S&H.

News in Review

Maury commissioner takes steps to preserve GM land The Tennessean - 9/19/07

Thirty acres of Civil War battlefield land are destroyed every day, Maury County Commissioner Ty Cobb said, citing the Civil War Preservation Trust. It's motivated Cobb to seek support from county commissioners to buy 86 acres from General Motors. In his mind, about 30 acres of that land could be used for a new school and to preserve the rest as Civil War battlefield. A consultant was in Maury County last week looking at ways to tie together battlefields and other historic sites for a Civil War heritage trail as part of the war's sesquicentennial. That could include "Jackson's Shortcut," a roadway Andrew Jackson used in 1814 on his way to the Battle of New Orleans.

Historical artifacts to be unveiled at County Archives The Tennessean, "Williamson A.M." - 9/28/07

A new collection of Civil War relics and other military and historical artifacts has been added to the Williamson County Archives and Museum. The new Battle Ground Academy Museum — a sectioned-off display within the larger museum — will be officially unveiled with fanfare on Sunday, September 30.

Plans start early for Battle of Franklin anniversary Franklin Review Appeal - 10/3/07

The 2007 ceremony will take place at the eastern flank of the Battle of Franklin Park off Carnton Lane. With the Nov. 30 commemoration falling on a Friday, there is also an opportunity to chain up the activities to create a long weekend centered on Civil War history.
