

## STFB Land Acquisition Udate

Save The Franklin Battlefield officers have been in discussion with the owners of a 5 acre parcel of the Franklin Battlefield that is now for sale. It is parcel 15.01 on the above map and near Collins Farm (parcel 45) that STFB purchased in 2001 and transferred to the City of Franklin Parks Department in 2007. The extreme lower right corner of the map shows the very northwest corner of the City's Eastern Flank Battlefield Park (golf course).

All of these parcels are ground that Loring's division traversed during the November 30, 1864 battle. His men were under heavy canister and musket fire from the main Federal line plus shell-fire from Fort Granger as they climbed over the RR tracks and assaulted this eastern end of the trench line. This is where Adam's brigade had to shift to the west before charging into the enemy's trenches. The Federal line parallels Stewart Street at the very top of the map and ends at the railroad tracks.

The 5 acres are open ground with some trees but no structures. Additionally, we believe the site contains significant terrain features that will add to the interpretation and understanding of this portion of the battlefield. We also are in discussions with the national preservation organizations that could possibly become partners in the purchase of these 5 important acres of open battlefield.

As this project got underway, parcel 43.04 also came on the market. The south end of this 11 acres is just off the map. We have begun work to evaluate the possibilities of structuring a deal to buy both parcels, but most likely the 5 acre project will go forward first, and the 11 acres would be purchased sometime later. Neither parcel has buildings or structures to be preserved, and both are very important battlefield land.

As with Collins Farm, our long term goal would be to place this hallowed ground under conservation easement ensuring its perpetual preservation. Our rough estimate is that, with participation of the national preservation groups, and state and local groups, STFB would have to raise roughly \$100,000 of new money to do both deals. We will not begin the actual fund raising until the deals are further along in the purchase process, and the projects are incorporated into the plans of the national preservation groups.

#### We need your Pledge of help:

Our next step is to identify those supporters and groups who will be able to help us financially when the time comes – either late 2010 or early 2011. We need a measure of possible financial support now so that we can include pledged funds as part of our purchase plan to the national preservation groups.

#### More New Construction on BGA

The Williamson County Commission is making preparations for additional new construction on the former Battle Ground Academy campus, located just south of the Carter House. This site witnessed some of the fiercest fighting during the Battle of Franklin. When the County purchased the old BGA campus in 1998, there was hope that with the resurgence of interest for a Battle of Franklin park at the epicenter of the battle, the BGA property could be acquired in the near future by some group or coalition and set aside for a park. At that time, STFB and other preservation groups advised the county that any new construction on the campus would jeopardize such plans.

In spite of strong public opinion to the contrary, the county built the main Williamson County Library on the northernmost portion of the grounds, nearest the Carter House. This was followed several years later with more new construction for the Middle College High School.

Now, County Commissioners have voted to fund demolition of most of Fleming Hall, opening the way for construction of a new replacement structure including a planned 750-seat community theater. No timetable or firm plans are in place for the new construction but the groundwork is laid. We will continue to watch and keep you informed.
