Battle of Franklin Anniversary Events

The 134th anniversary of the Battle of Franklin is November 30. A weekend of activities has been planned by the Carter House, Lotz House Museum, and the local Sons of Confederate Veterans to include living history, ceremonies, lectures, and the annual march.

The events at the Carter House will start at noon on Saturday, November 28 and last until 4 pm. Reenactors will portray soldiers lives. Thomas Cartwright will do his portrayal of Sam Watkins, a private with Co. H, 1st Tennessee at 1:30 pm.

On Sunday, participants will meet at Winstead Hill and depart at 4pm for the annual march following the Confederate soldiers path to the Carter House. The march will go to the Lotz House to commemorate the "high water mark" of the Confederate break through of the Union lines. Documents show that Confederate Captain Richard N. Herbert, of the 24th Tennessee Infantry, was wounded on Columbia Pike near the Lotz House. At the conclusion of the march, everyone is invited to view the new display of artifacts from Confederate soldiers who were in the bloody struggle at Franklin. The main item being the sword carried by General Hiram Granbury of Texas who was killed leading the charge. The sword hasn't been in Franklin since the General dropped it 134 years ago. There will also be a wreath laying on the back porch at the Carter House and comments regarding some of the men who gave their lives for their cause. A memorial service is planned at 6pm at the Confederate Cemetery followed by more soldier stories.

On Monday, the actual anniversary of the battle, participants will again meet at Winstead Hill at 3:30 pm where they will begin their march to the vicinity of Cheatham's Head Quarters near Merrill Hill. Discussions on the last preparations for battle will be held before marching to the yard of the Carter House to conduct final services.
