Buying Your Books at Amazon Helps STFB

You may have known that when you buy STFB recommended books at the Amazon.com on-line book store, up to 15% of the purchase is returned to STFB. You can get to the STFB book store by scrolling about 2/3 of the way down the STFB home page and clicking on "STFB Electronic Book Store" link.

The recommended books are grouped by area of interest, and when you follow the links to Amazon and actually buy a book, 5 to 15% of the purchase price, depending on the price and type of the book, is credited to STFB. Earned payments are sent to STFB quarterly.

BUT, did you know that STFB can get credit for other books you buy at Amazon.com no matter the topic - carpentry, adventure, duck calling, sci-fi. It's true, all those purchases can financially aid STFB - but you have to finagle things just a bit.

First, search for the books you want and jot down the 10 digit ISBN number for each. Then type the following into the 'location' field of your browser some browsers call this the URL field - it's near the top of the browser page:

www.amazon.com/exec/obidos/ISBN=****/savethefranklinbA/

This may be case sensitive for some browsers, so everything is lower case except for ISBN and the final A. Replace the **** with the ISBN of the desired book, and press ENTER. You are now ready to buy a book.

A simpler method is to go to the STFB page - www.franklin-stfb.org - link to the STFB Book Store, and scroll to the bottom of the Book Store home page where you will find the above character string pre-typed for you. It is in bold black type.

Swipe it with your mouse using the left button, click edit, click copy. Erase your browser's 'location' field, and click edit, click

paste. Use the cursor to replace the **** with the ISBN for the book you want, press ENTER, and BINGO you are ready to add it to your Amazon. com Shopping cart.

It is not nearly as complicated as it sounds once you get the hang of it - and STFB will get credit for all the books you buy at Amazon.com. Give it a try. It's an easy way to slip a buck or two to STFB.
