Each of you is very important to all we are collectively doing here in Franklin and I thank you for your continued support.



First Ever <u>Tour of Lorings Advance</u> Set For Saturday Nov 5 – 10:00 AM

We now expect the purchase of the 5 acre parcel of Lorings Advance to complete before year end. This important part of the Franklin Battlefield is being protected with funds from the Civil War Trust, the National Parks system, and STFB. We have arranged this FREE tour for our STFB

membership and interested others. Few Civil War enthusiasts have seen this open ground because it has been landlocked for years and has no public access yet.

Our own incomparable Thomas Cartwright of Carter House and History Channel notoriety will lead the tour and tell of the determined and heroic soldiers who crossed this ground under terrible fire to reach the Federal line. Maps will be provided.

We are certain that those who have closely followed the many preservation efforts here in Franklin will be thrilled to finally view the important terrain of this open 5 acres, and will quickly see how it can add to our collective understanding of the Battle of Franklin.

STFB has committed to the Civil War Trust that we will raise \$50,000 for the Lorings Advance purchase. This tour marks the beginning of that campaign. We have received several pledges in recent months that will start the fund raising. First in line are our good friends of the UK CWRT in London, England under the leadership of Greg Bayne who pledged \$500 for this purchase last spring, and have already sent the check. These are truly exciting times for preservation efforts here in Franklin. We will see you at the tour!

Parking - Please remember that we will have to cross private property to reach the Lorings Advance parcel, and we do so only with special permission beforehand. If you park on Adams Street, you can walk to the tour using the driveway at 1319 Adams.

We also have arranged permission to park at the Williamson County Insulation Company at the east end of Meadowlawn Drive and to use a gate behind 319 Meadowlawn (red house) just across the street.

STFB Annual Meeting & Dinner Thursday, November 17

The STFB Annual Meeting and Dinner will be Thursday evening, November 17, at St Paul's Episcopal Church in Franklin. We plan to gather in Otey Hall at 6:00 PM with a **full dinner buffet at 6:30 PM.** A short business meeting will review the STFB 2011 activities, and we will then make our annual Preservation Award.

Our speaker will be author and Civil War student Lee Ann Newton of Murfreesboro who had one of those eureka strokes of discovery. Buried behind an old bookcase, she found a lost copy of "The Civil War Memoirs of Erastus Winters Corporal Co K 50th OVI 1861-1865". Lee Ann quickly realized its importance and had it republished. The book is a very well written 1905 account detailing Erastus' experiences at Perryville, the Atlanta campaign, Franklin, Cahaba prison, and the Sultana disaster. The Franklin Battlefield Commission has set the battle anniversary, November 30, as the date for the commemorative Illumination. The event will be held at 4PM at the Rest Haven Cemetery on north 4th street rather than the Confederate Cemetery. Rest Haven is a much smaller venue so the size of the Illumination will be smaller. News In Review October 2011

Blue and Gray Days Nov 12-14 — Battle of Franklin Trust *Battlefield Dispatch* — October 2011 — FRANKLIN — Blue and Gray Days is an annual living history event which features reenactors

and artisans performing their crafts to show the public what life was like during the Civil War. The event began as a Carnton Plantation tradition but has grown and is now held at both Carnton Plantation and The Carter House. Both location will have artillery demonstrations. Reenactors will be on site to answer questions about soldier life, Civil War flags, and slave life. Carton Plantation will also feature Abe Lincoln, musicians, and a period cooking demonstration.

Film shown Oct. 14 chronicles Franklin's unknown soldier — *The Tennessean*, "Williamson A.M." — 10/5/11 — FRANKLIN — The premiere of *Heading Back Home* was shown on Oct. 14 at Franklin Theatre. At the center of that story is the city of Franklin and a man whose name no one knows, a man who probably died sometime in late November 1864, about the time of the Battle of Franklin. That man was a soldier whose bones were accidentally unearthed by construction workers in the spring of 2009. He was later reburied before thousands of people who crowded Franklin's streets. Proceeds from the showing will be donated to battlefield preservation efforts in Franklin. (STFB sells the DVD)

Grave Matters set for Oct. 29 in Downtown
Franklin — Williamson Herald— 10/11/11 —
FRANKLIN— Grave Matters will be held Saturday,
Oct. 29, 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. as part of Pumpkinfest in
downtown Franklin. The guided tour of the Old City
and Rest Haven cemeteries features costumed actors
portraying the most colorful, historically important and
often tragic souls buried there. Produced by Franklin
walking tour company Franklin on Foot and the
Heritage Foundation of Franklin and Williamson
County, proceeds will support local historic
preservation efforts.

Civil War re-enactments grow as historic date nears — The Tennessean, "Williamson A.M." — 10/14/11 — FRANKLIN — On October 15-16, reenactors and 1860s-era vendors mixed with a crowd of about 4,000 people as they marked the 147th anniversary of the Battle of Franklin. The event was held at the 200-acre Harlinsdale Park to provide enough room for a real-life demonstration of how Confederate and Union forces met on Nov. 30, 1864. The actual battle took place along Columbia Avenue. The park also provided clear sight lines so spectators had a better view of the demonstration than what they might find in modern-day Franklin. As for the event's authenticity, Joe Grosson, who coordinated the event, said the replica troops were as historically accurate as possible to preserve the authenticity of the battle.
